

SPA SOLUTION

Fresh Fill Procedures:

Fill the hot tub to the desired water level. Set the temperature to the desired setting. Once the set temperature is reached, turn on a pump, either low or high speed will be fine, ensure that the air selectors are turned off (no air) and add the following:

1. Add **60 mls** of **Spa Clarifier**
2. Add **30 mls** of **Spa Stain Control**
3. Add **30 g** of **Spa Sani Brom** (Bromine) or **15 g** of **Spa Boom** (Chlorine)
4. Please feel free to bring a water sample to the store as often as you wish.
5. Before adding Spa Solution ensure to check your PH and Alkalinity levels as indicated below, adjust water as required.

Ph Level	Alkalinity Level	Calcium Hardness Level	Bromine / Chlorine Level

Weekly Maintenance Procedures:

1. Add **1/2 capful** of **Spa Sani Brom** or **Spa Boom** **twice per week.**
2. Add **30 mls** of **Spa Stain Control**
3. Add **30 mls** of **Spa Clarifier.**
4. To maintain the effectiveness of spa filters you should rinse the debris bag and filters once per week.

Monthly Maintenance Procedures

Monthly, or bi-monthly, depending on frequency of use, filters must be removed, thoroughly rinsed and then soaked for 5-6 hours in **Spa Contact**. After soaking, rinse filters' thoroughly ensuring none of the filter cleaner gets into your hot tub water. It is suggested you consider having two sets of filters and rotate them monthly as this will enhance the life of the filters.

Quarterly

Changing Your Spa Water:

1. Quarterly, tub water will require changing and a new bottle of **Spa Solution** must be added in accordance with **Spa Solution** manufacturer's directions.
2. Please refer to the owner's manual for the method required to drain your specific spa. Georgian Hot Tubs has accessories available to help you with this procedure.

Once the tub is completely drained:

1. Clean tub surface, the most cost effective method is a solution of 50% vinegar & 50% hot water. A soft sponge or non-abrasive pad is ideal for wiping the inside of the spa. It is suggested that you consider applying a conditioner on the surface of the spa, on a yearly basis, in order to ensure that its "new" luster is maintained throughout its life
2. After rinsing, close the drain and fill the spa to desired level using a mix of 50% non-softened water and 50% softened water.

Foamy Water

1. Pure white foam is the likely result of residual laundry soap from bathing attire or shampoo. Add **Spa Anti-Foam** very gradually, a tablespoon at a time and allow the water to circulate for several minutes prior to the next application. A suggestion would be to apply Spa-Anti Foam with a spray applicator for more efficient coverage.
2. Discoloured foam is likely bacteria. Discontinue using the hot tub and add either one-half capful of **Spa Boom** (Chlorine) or one capful of **Spa Sani Brom** (Bromine). It is also suggested that you bring a water sample to Georgian Hot Tubs for testing.
